RESPONSE TO PUBLIC COMMENT

Public Works Director Egger advised that it is a minor project to fix manhole and water valve covers that elevate over the street surface. The Public Works crew patches around the cover so equipment such as a snowplow wing doesn't get caught on it. The project should be short term and isolated to the Evermoor Parkway area.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

- a. Amendments to City Code, Title 4, Article B, and Title 9, Chapter 6 Relating to Connections to Municipal Utility Systems

Public Works Director Egger explained the amendments to the City Code will require any property wishing to delay connection to the City's utilities to obtain a thorough compliance inspection when City sewer and water first become available. Thereafter, properties must submit compliance inspections every three years - up to the 10-year mandatory connection deadline.

Councilmember Essler received an email from a resident in the affected area and questioned why all rural residents are not required to have septic inspections. Mr. Egger advised that it depends on the area of the city, land-use zones, and whether municipal water and sewer systems are available to the residents. The purpose of the amendment is to help protect public health and the environment.

Mayor Weisensel opened the public hearing at 7:13 p.m.
