She also acknowledged that the city was a finalist for the Government/Community Facility award for the new Police and Public Works building, as well as the Restaurant/Entertainment award for the Lifetime project. Council member Theisen recognized the staff work behind the scenes of all of the wins. Mayor Weisensel also expressed gratitude towards city staff.
