- a. Playground Proposals - Dallara Park

Parks and Recreation Director Schultz discussed the long-term Parks Maintenance Capital Improvement Plan, which includes funding for the replacement of the playground equipment at Dallara Park. The existing play equipment at Dallara Park was installed in 2001, which is the expected lifespan of this equipment.

The neighborhood residents were invited to an open house and also provided an opportunity to weigh in online via the Parks and Recreation Department web page. Based on the review by the City Commissioners (Parks & Rec and Youth Commissioners) and the input received online from the neighborhood, staff is recommending City Council approve the purchase of playground equipment for Dallara Park from Northland Recreation - Likke Tykes. Should this project move forward, staff tentatively plans to have the existing equipment removed in early September and the new equipment installed in October.
