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PUBLIC HEARINGS

7.a. Establish 2023 Budget and Levy

City Administrator Martin presented the City's Final Operating Budget and the Levy for 2023. The draft 2023 Budget presents the 8th year in a row of tax rate reduction as the tax rate is reduced by 12.5%. Mr. Martin highlighted new construction saved pre-existing homeowners \$33 on their taxes. Without \$98.2 million in new construction, taxes on median valued home would've increased \$102 in 2023. Overall the typical median value home increase (7%) would see City taxes reduced \$70 with proposed budget.

Mr. Martin summarized the main expenditures leading to the budget increase within the presentation and presented each departments budget and highlighted any changes. Mr. Martin also explained the lengthy process for creating the budget.
