City Administrator Martin reflected on Leprechaun Days and thanked staff and the volunteer committee for pulling off a successful Leprechaun Days.

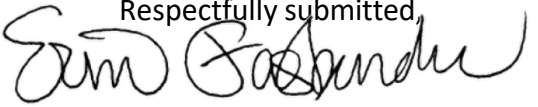
- b. Upcoming Community Calendar
